

## **Inoculant Handling Tips**

Inoculants can help to reduce shrink and spoilage, but they need to be applied alive to be effective. Here's how to get the most back from your inoculant:

- Step 1
- **Store inoculants in a cool place.** If the label says to refrigerate or freeze, then do so. Avoid freeze-thaw cycles because they can kill the bugs.
- Step 2
- **Take care during transport.** Avoid direct sunlight or heat (such as on the dashboard, on a pickup truck bed or in a hot vehicle).
- Step 3
- **Use cool water.** Feel the water to make sure it is cool. If you use a hose to fill the tank, let it run for a bit so that the water is cool.
- Step 4
- **Keep it flowing.** Calibrate the applicator properly and check the level in the tank every two hours. If the level of inoculant hasn't changed, find the problem and fix it.
- Step 5
- **Keep it cool.** Take the temperature or feel the mixture frequently to ensure that the inoculant/water mixture is staying cool in the tank. If it heats up (more than 90 degrees), cool it down (such as with a frozen soda bottle). Avoid using ice because this will dilute the inoculant.
- Step
- **Use it up.** Use the solution within 24 hours of mixing with water.

Bottom line: To get the most from your inoculant, keep it cool and make sure you are applying it at the proper rate.
